PASTOR PENNY'S 2 JINGLES

The sites and sounds of the holidays can stir up so many memories and feelings. Those of when we were children and the joy of festivities, presents and magical anticipation. As adults the sounds of laughter, family, friends, church, traditions, giving and the joy on other's faces from receiving, make the holidays merry and bright. I also know that for some this time of year can be very difficult. The distant memories of joy can be clouded by grief or sadness when loved ones are not present to participate. As I pondered what brings one JOY, I thought about the worldly things that we sometimes look to, a warm home and plenty of food, family to share it with all the way down to the simplest, a smile or touch.

The Christmases we celebrate are far from what that first Christmas was like, yet even before in preparation for Christ's immergence into this dark world God brought surmountable joy in miracles abounding. He gave unbelievable joy to a couple nearly 100 years old when Elizabeth conceived John! The fear and joy Zechariah had when he saw and talked with Gabriel, and the unbelievable message he had for him. I often think about Zechariah, like him we live in the here and now, that which is temporal. Other than Sarah, a woman's window for bearing and raising a child by human standards is shut at a certain decade. Can you blame him for having a hard time grasping what Gabriel was telling him? I am sure both were wondering even if God makes this come to pass, we are so old how will we ever be able to physically raise a baby or a young child?! I know that would be first on my mind.

Have you ever waited for something for so long, prayed, begged, pleaded and then just resolved to the fact it wasn't going to happen? Sometimes God is not saying NO, but WAIT FOR IT. Those gifts that he has waiting for us are not always in our timing or our ways, but he does that to send a message and show the world that nothing is impossible with our God. What Joy those two shared when they found out that God's plan had come true. And yet it was nothing compared to the Joy of the baby who leapt inside of Elizabeth at the sound of Mary's voice and the anticipation of the precious gift she was carrying. In his Gospel Luke records this interaction of Mary and Elizabeth so tenderly. He tries to encompass the Joy that was spilling forth at the very presence of the Messiah even though still in womb. Sometimes we forget that John was also a gift. He was sent to prepare the way for the Messiah, to turn hearts towards him. To point the way to salvation and the only one who could give it.

We must remember that Joy is from the Lord. We can be happy or sad, and Joy has no bearing on our circumstances. It is the gift from God buried deep within our hearts, the Hope that when things are bleak or dark that even in mourning, we are told Joy comes in the morning. As Christians we have been given not only the gift of salvation, but of a personal relationship with Christ. One where we can cast our burdens at his feet, he says my yoke is easy and my burden is light. He is the one holding tomorrow so we can rest in him, his timing, his ways, his plans even when we don't understand, trusting that through all of it, the Joy that he has given will NEVER depart.

Joy may seem elusive but it is as broad as love, grace and mercy. Joy may not come in the pretty package and bows that we want; it may not look like the shiny tantalizing attribute that we have always thought. But Paul encompasses the true picture of Joy in Hebrews 12:2 in the amplified Bible "Looking away from all that will distract us and focusing our eyes on Jesus, who is the Author and Perfector of faith, who for the JOY (of accomplishing the goal) set before Him endured the cross, disregarding the shame and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God (revealing His deity, His authority and the completion of His work.)

Joy to the World the Lord has Come.... And is coming Back! I've got the Joy Joy Joy down in the depths of my heart. Where????? Down in the Depths of my Heart to Stay.

Merry Christmas! And may you be filled with the Joy of not just the season, but of Christ himself! Blessings

YOUTH GROUP

We have had an awesome first half of the year already! The kids have been learning and absorbing so much. There has always been a super fun game to finish it off and their favorite foods to fuel their minds. I can't thank Kristen enough for helping orchestrate and team up to teach these hungry kids.

For November, we talked about giving and an attitude of gratitude. As kids, they wondered what they could possibly do to help a situation as big as the food pantry needs? .We prayed about it and broke it down to something so simple that everyone could participate.

We wanted to try to raise as much mac n cheese as we could in 2 1/2 weeks. Then, to make it fun we challenged the adults to a contest. At the final count, the Adults won but only by 9 boxes. (108 to 99) for a total of **207** boxes. Per serving, it would potentially feed 828 meals and at 1090 noodles per box there were 225,630 noodles on the stage in the church.

Here is the best part. Some said but why mac n cheese when the food pantry needs so much more? I said it is a start.

When we went to drop the boxes off at the food pantry, the volunteer's eyes lit up and said 'Oh that is wonderful! We are almost out of mac n cheese and with the holidays coming and kids home we really needed that." The boxes weighed in at over 116 pounds!

So the kids, Kristen, and I would like to thank everyone who joined in on this venture and the fun attitude of gratitude with the giving that it provided us and those who will be the recipients. Thank You!.
